Bee Challenge

We are learning to write non-chronological reports in English.

Find some examples of non-chronological reports in books or online. What are the main things that you notice about them? What are the features?

Research life on the home front, find facts and make notes about:

- Evacuation
- The Blackout
- Rationing
- The Blitz
- Propaganda

Create a poster to help you remember common fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents. For example:

$$0.1 = 10\% = 1/10$$

$$0.2 = 20\% = 1/5$$

$$0.25 = 25\% = \frac{1}{4}$$

$$0.5 = 50\% = \frac{1}{2}$$

$$0.75 = 75\% = \frac{3}{4}$$

If you know these, what else do you know?

Collect examples of percentages in the environment.

These could be from newspapers, magazines, advertisements, shops, packaging, or even websites.

Imagine you are an evacuee leaving London during the Blitz in 1941.

Write a letter home to your family. You could include descriptions of the train journey, the countryside, other evacuees and your new home.

Research how war affected the lives of women in Britain during the 1930s and 1940s.

How did their lives change? Which new roles did they take on? What happened after the war?

Code-breaking played a vital role in the success of the war effort during WW2.

Find out about the Enigma machine and the significance of Bletchley Park in Milton Keynes.


