Bee Challenge	Draw a story map that shows your journey to school.  Think about what you do to get ready for school in the morning as well as the landmarks you pass on the way.	5 x table puzzle  (5) (10) (15) (20) (25)  Karen is given 3 darts. She throws them at the board above. Which 3 numbers would she need to hit to get the following scores?  30, 55, 15, 40, 45  She could hit the same number more than once.  Are there any with multiple possible answers?	Create and Make: Create a piece of artwork that shows the celebration of Christmas or Eid-Al-Fatr.  Please remember, in Islam it is forbidden to draw Allah or the Prophet Muhammed [PBUH]
Brave-Bee Challenge	Find and copy a set of instructions from somewhere at home.  For example: a cooking recipe or a Lego building kit.  You may also wish to photograph examples of instructions you see around town.	On Thursday 42 packets of sweets were sold.  On Friday, 34 more were sold, and on Saturday another 146.  Use a pictorial or written method to calculate how many sweets were sold altogether.  Create some similar word problems of your own.	Design and Do:  Find out about foods that are in season at this time of year — foods that can be grown locally and sustainably without travelling miles from abroad.  Find a recipe that uses these foods, make it and photograph the results stating what the ingredients were and why they are sustainable.
Super-Bee Challenge	Write a haiku poem about a type of weather.  Remember a haiku has 5 syllables (beats) in the first and third lines and 7 syllables in the second line.  We will be learning about these nearer to Christmas.	When your family go food shopping, select two items from the list and add the cost using the traditional column addition method.  Repeat as many times as you can, using two different items each time.  Present your work by drawing pictures of the items you choose, alongside your column addition calculation.	Research and Report:  Use the internet or books to research the significance of Remembrance Day.  You could ask relatives if there are any personal connections to the armed forces in your family.
